He also regularly assists government contract clients to conduct their due diligence and recognize and mitigate government contracts-associated risks during the merger and acquisition process.

Dj also works as a consultant with Crowell & Moring's affiliate, <u>C&M International</u>, where he assists clients with international market access issues and represents clients through the multinational negotiation and national implementation of treaties.
